On 5 November 2025, the Napier Centre 4 Healing (NC4H) was honoured to welcome a delegation from the **South African National Petroleum Company (SANPC)** to its Durban premises for an official project handover ceremony.

The event celebrated not only a most generous donation of **R497,075.00** from SANPC– an organisation responsible for managing and developing South Africa’s petroleum and gas resources – but also the deepening of a partnership devoted to sustainable human development and community renewal.



Speaking at the ceremony, **Ms. Diadlakazi Ntloko**, Stakeholder Relations Manager at SANPC, addressed NC4H residents, highlighting the importance of both knowledge and practical skills. She emphasised that skills development is essential for lasting change, enabling individuals to take ownership of their lives and find meaningful employment after completing the Centre’s aftercare programme.

The SANPC funding has been **applied entirely** toward the empowerment and upliftment of both residents and staff through accredited skills development and training programmes. These initiatives have played a vital role in helping residents gain employable skills, breaking the cycle of dependency and homelessness, and nurturing confidence and independence.

Several residents have already completed **SANPC-sponsored courses** and have since gone on to establish small businesses, while staff members have benefited from advanced training that enhances the quality of care and support offered within the Centre.

Expressing heartfelt gratitude, Fr. Stephen Tully, Chairperson of NC4H, remarked:

“This generous contribution from SANPC has brought renewed hope and tangible change to our residents. It is through partnerships like these that transformation becomes real – where individuals once defined by struggle now stand empowered with dignity, skills, and purpose. We are deeply grateful to SANPC for believing in our mission and investing in human potential.”



Through **SANPC’s generosity, residents of NC4H** are now gaining hands-on skills in bricklaying, building not only structures but also stronger **foundations for their future**.



During September 2025, two residents, **Lindani Nkosi and Siyabonga Bhengu**, successfully completed a bricklaying course at Abethu Artisan Skills Training Academy. The practical knowledge and experience they acquired are helping them prepare for stable employment and self-sustainability, empowering them to build independent, hope-filled lives beyond the Centre.
